## JPL 7112 Form Instructions

### **SECTION 1 – Subcontractor Property Authorization for All Items (≥\$1000):**

**Step 1:** Identify Subcontractor, Subcontract Number and Date.

**Step 2:** Provide requested equipment description. If there are multiple items of equipment, attach the list of equipment to be purchased on a separate sheet along with the required descriptions.

**Step 3:** Under “Purchase Justification,” briefly provide the rationale for the need to purchase the identified piece/pieces of equipment.

**Step 4:** Obtain all three required signatures, as follows: 1) Subcontractor Official, 2) JPL Contract Technical Manager and 3) JPL Subcontracts Manager.

**Note:** For an item of equipment >\$1,000 which is not a deliverable, or will not become a part of a stated deliverable in a subcontract, “equipment” is defined as:

- Test equipment or tooling (including components), or
- Non-flight space property, including ground support equipment, and
- Is generally commercially available and capable of stand-alone use.

*Does not include materials or work-in-process.*

### **SECTION 2 – Subcontractor Property Vesting Authorization for All Items (list all items to be vested regardless of value):** *(Note: Property may only vest with Universities and Not-For-Profit Organizations)*

**Step 1:** Determine if property (of any value) is to vest with Subcontractor, by marking “X” Yes or No in “Will the Property Vest with the Subcontractor?” and provide rationale as to why the equipment should vest with the Subcontractor. If “no”, proceed to Step 3, below.

**Step 2:** If items are to be vested with the Subcontractor, as listed and described in Section 1 above, forward the form to the NASA Industrial Property Officer, M/S 180-200 for vesting approval.

**Step 3:** Once the form is complete, with all required signatures, forward it to the JPL Property Group, M/S 111-B21 for Non-Availability Certificate screening signature and approval stamp.

**Step 4:** Once the Property Group provides the “Non-Availability Certificate” approval and returns the document to the Subcontracts Manager, the Subcontracts Manager shall notify the Subcontractor and provide them a copy of the fully approved form.

**Step 5:** The original is to be filed in the subcontract binder under the appropriate Property tab.

### **Commercial Organizations**

Complete only Section 1 of this form when a Commercial organization subcontractor requests approval to purchase equipment/property of any value. *Property cannot be vested with a Commercial organization subcontractor.*
