

A Request for Proposal for the OneNASA portal was issued on August 27, 2002. We are pleased to announce that Phase I contracts have been awarded for the OneNASA portal. The contracts have been awarded to the following companies to proceed with the artistic design and technical plan to be delivered at a Preliminary Design Review to be held in November 2002 in Washington, DC:

- Deloitte Consulting and Roundarch
- eTouch Systems and Critical Mass
- Euro RSCG Interaction
- Raytheon Technical Services Company

One of the above Contractors will be awarded a contract option to implement their design and supporting technical solution for a full, operational deployment on February 1, 2003.
