NASA Business Opportunities Expo Port Canaveral, FL



On October 23, 2019, JPL Small Business Administrator Matthew Christian participated in the annual NASA KSC Business Opportunities Expo co-sponsored by the NASA KSC Prime Contractors Board, U.S. Air Force 45th Space Wing, and Canaveral Port Authority. This is the largest outreach event hosted by the

agency. The one-day event featured 229 exhibitors representing KSC large prime contractors, NASA Field Centers, other federal government agencies, and small businesses. A total of 2,283 registered attendees participated with a focus on General Construction and Construction-related small business exhibitors. This opportunity enabled the SBPO to identify potential small business capabilities, products, and services for possible matches to JPL procurement and technical requirements.


JPL Historic Mission Spotlight

NEOWISE: On December 14, 2019, JPL celebrated the 10th launch anniversary of NEOWISE. The NEOWISE mission uses a



space telescope to hunt for asteroids and comets, including those that could pose a threat to Earth.

The Wide-Field Infrared Survey Explorer, or WISE, the space telescope was originally designed to survey the sky in infrared, detecting asteroids, stars and some of the faintest galaxies in space. It did so successfully until completing its primary mission in February 2011. Observations resumed in December 2013, when the telescope was taken out of hibernation and re-purposed for the NEOWISE project as an instrument to study near-Earth objects, or NEOs, as well as more distant asteroids and comets.
